## JUMS-policy on research data and documentations of the research process

An essential component of good academic practice is to ensure the intersubjective comprehensibility (reproducibility) of the results achieved. Meeting this requirement is of central importance for every research project. It should therefore accompany the research process from the very beginning.

As an academic journal, JUMS welcomes well-documented research and analysis processes as well as — within the framework of legal boundaries — the publication of the data, programme codes and other documents used, which enable intersubjective traceability of the research results (reproducibility).

JUMS therefore encourages all authors to deposit their data and additional information in the <u>JUMS</u> <u>data archive</u>. The data in the JUMS data archive is linked to your article. This makes your article even more visible, and the data and documentation provided make the results of your work traceable and the conclusions of your paper even more robust and trustworthy.

The specific information and data that should be stored in the data archive strongly depends on the research topic and the chosen methodological approach. The VHB (Verband der Hochschullehrer:innen für Betriebswirtschaft e.V.) provides a <u>useful initial guide</u> ("Good Professional Practices") on this topic. Often, your supervisors are also happy to help you in case of upcoming questions.
